

# CONTEMPORARY EUROPEAN STUDIES, A.A.-B.A.

This is a suggested course plan. It is highly recommended that you meet regularly with your academic advisor to determine your course selection and progress toward graduation.

Students who transfer to UNC under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) have all lower-level General Education requirements completed, but must complete these requirements through transfer or UNC coursework: Global Language (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/global-language/>), Research and Discovery (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/research-discovery/>), Lifetime Fitness (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/lifetime-fitness/>), Communication Beyond Carolina (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/communication-beyond/>), Campus Life Experience (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/campus-life-experience/>), and, where applicable, Supplemental General Education. Students who do not transfer in under the CAA should work closely with their advisor to determine which requirements apply to them for the IDEAs in Action General Education curriculum (<http://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/>).

If not, they may need to take a summer course (if available) or a 9th semester to complete the five-course sequence in that language if they choose to take Bosnian-Croatian-Serbian, Czech, Polish, or Turkish.

Students are required to take four courses from one theme, one course from the other, and a sixth course from either theme or the list of electives.
