

# ROMANCE LANGUAGES– HISPANIC LINGUISTICS, A.A.- B.A.

This is a suggested course plan. It is highly recommended that you meet regularly with your academic advisor to determine your course selection and progress toward graduation.

Students who transfer to UNC under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) have all lower-level General Education requirements completed, but must complete these requirements through transfer or UNC coursework: Global Language (<https://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/global-language/>), Research and Discovery (<https://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/research-discovery/>), Lifetime Fitness (<https://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/lifetime-fitness/>), Communication Beyond Carolina (<https://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/communication-beyond/>), Campus Life Experience (<https://catalog.unc.edu/undergraduate/ideas-in-action/campus-life-experience/>), and, where applicable, Supplemental General Education.
